My name is Jaysen Forsberg. I have been a resident of Allen County, Indiana for twenty years. With urgency and love, I hope to communicate with you a most profound discovery.

Despite what your calendar says, we are not living in the year 2021. It is actually 1775. We are not suffering a Covid-19 pandemic. Rather, we are tolerating, what Thomas Paine referred to as, "[*The Fatal 19th*](#)". This was a day

of sorrow, becoming the final impetus for the American Revolution. Less than three months later, a line in the sand was drawn.

[The Declaration of the Causes and Necessity of Taking Up Arms](#) was a resolution adopted by the Second Continental Congress on July 6, 1775. It explains why the thirteen colonies had taken up arms in what had become the American Revolutionary War. The language was as powerful, if not more powerful than the [Declaration of Independence](#). It is clear—America is swirling in a sociopolitical revolution this very hour. We are protesting the school boards, homeschooling our children and running for political offices. Had we stayed in touch with the "ABC's" of our original struggle, we would not be in this predicament.

What is happening in Allen County, Indianapolis and everywhere else, is not just a collision of ideas and egos. This goes far beyond patriotic outcry, tea party sentiments or rising taxes—it is a copy/paste of former days. Each bold header is a verbatim excerpt from this line-in-the-sand founding document.

The ABC's, verbatim from 1775

A. The inhabitants of Boston being confined within that town by the general their governor
(a quarantine perhaps?)

B. ...the commercial intercourse of whole colonies, with foreign countries, and with each other, was cut off (Economies were shut down, here and around the world)

C. Wives are separated from their husbands, children from their parents, the aged and the sick from their relations and friends, who wish to attend and comfort them (Social distancing, hypochondria and healthcare system tyranny.)

D. ...those who have been used to live in plenty and even elegance, are reduced to deplorable distress (Trapped in nursing homes. Contact tracing. Kids home alone, or abused in school. Intimidation and exclusion. Distress in the comfortable and wealthy communities.)

E. Parliament adopted an insidious manoeuvre calculated to divide us...where colony should bid against colony (Marxism and monopoly. States in vicious competition to earn customers, both politically and economically. Residents voting with their feet and moving away.)

F. ...uninformed what ransom would redeem their lives; and thus to extort...unknown sums that should be sufficient to gratify, if possible to gratify... (Executive actions issued faster than states and cities could keep up, leaving them uninformed and in a state of chaos. Insatiable, ever growing lists of requirements. Essentially, legal extortion of wealth and power from good people who are willing to cooperate. 'What must I do today, to avoid trouble?')

G. Fruitless were all the entreaties, arguments, and eloquence of an illustrious band of the most distinguished peers, and commoners, who nobly and strenuously asserted the justice of our cause, to stay, or even to mitigate the heedless fury with which these accumulated and unexampled outrages were hurried on. (The perpetual dismissal, often with malice, the voice of We the People. Two years of being ignored, censored or actively persecuted. “Distinguished Peers”: doctors, lawyers and educated professionals all brushed aside. The more prepared or prestigious you were, the less they listened.)

H. ...venting the grossest falsehoods and calumnies against the good people of these colonies... to ‘declare them all, either by name or description’, to be rebels and traitors... (Mothers, fathers, military veterans, public servants, small business owners alike; all common sense civilians are seen as painted as merciless and mean, enemies and traitors. The perfect example is the January 6th media narrative. What was a single day patriots ‘Woodstock’, was declared as an “insurrection”).

I. ...instigating the people of that province and the Indians to fall upon us...schemes have been formed to excite domestic enemies against us; (Trojan horse candidates—RINOS. A puppet president. Marxism, socialism and communism hiding behind the “better world” front organizations; assaulting and killing the elderly and innocents, shooting police, burning down cities and toppling monuments. In those days—the English parliament. In America today, these attacks were philosophically identical: radicalizing the hurting youth and the outliers of society to commit acts of atrocity.)

J. They have undertaken to give and grant our money without our consent (Trillions in printed stimulus. Private gains via test kits and vaccines. Funding for unelected power-silos: CDC, NIH, WHO, FDA, etc. Hundreds of federal sub-agencies all influenced by foreign and local interests. Pork filled monster bills, which are the modern day “intolerable acts”).

K. Statutes have been passed for extending the jurisdiction of courts beyond their ancient limits (More state and federal overreach. Even private organizations are enforcing their internal policies like they are criminal codes or constitutions. Masking and cleansing in public. Consumers mistreated or trespassed for exposing their nostrils—psychotic contradictions of natural laws, modern science and common sense. Local governments wildly extending their jurisdictions with the support of council members and employees.)

L. For depriving us of the accustomed and inestimable privilege of trial by jury, in cases affecting life and property (People and assets are seized by non-peers, without warrants, under duress, through channels other than criminal proceedings. The fear of litigation overshadowed the wellbeing and life of patients. Deadly and debilitating reactions to vaccines. Bans on simple medications. Fear of losing jobs, businesses and licenses.)

M. ...for suspending the legislatures of one of the colonies (Mountains of executive orders at state and federal levels, often issued to counteract each other. The largest branch of government, the legislature, totally cut out of the equation.)

N. ...interdicting all commerce to the capital of another (billions under public trust, flowing into deep pockets via big tech, big pharma, and non-profit conglomerates...Our founders coined this as "easy emoluments of statuteable plunder". Essentially, this is theft and monopoly made possible through legal loopholes and appointments of power, rather the process of elections and free speech.)

O. ...altering fundamentally the form of government (The existential threat of constitutional convention. To open the constitution up for changes? A Pandora box of national catastrophe. We mustn’t dare, under any circumstances, open up the United States Constitution for attack. States are to make their own laws not specifically mentioned. Until we are enforcing the constitution as it currently stands, any convention would trigger a mess of private interests merged with mass misunderstandings.)

P. ...exempting the ‘Murderers’ of colonists from legal trial, and in effect from punishment (Deep state hits on associates of power. The indirect violence via police stand-downs, and democratic cities refusing to punish or police criminal action. Hundreds of DC elites, levying war on the states and providing aid and comfort to the enemy—they have not seen their day in criminal court. Textbook treason. Why?)

Q. ...Colonists charged with committing certain offences, shall be transported to England to be tried (Arrest and abduction of pastors of other dissidents, who have not been convicted of a crime. And the reverse, as those rightfully incarcerated are relocated out of prisons, while innocent civilians are re-located to quarantine camps or home-learning.)

R. What is to defend us against so enormous, so unlimited a power? (The constitution. We the People. Remember, this document was drafted before we became a distinct and separate nation.)

S. Not a single man of those who assume it, is chosen by us; or is subject to our control or influence; (The dangers of foreign dominion. Unelected interested parties—the W.H.O, the UN among others. Domestic oligarchies (power drunk corporations) working to consolidate power and resources.)

T. By one statute it is declared, that parliament can ‘of Right make Laws to bind us *in all cases whatsoever*’ (The Patriot Act. The Affordable Healthcare Act. The Cares Act. The Equality Act.)

U. ...they are all of them exempt from the Operation of such Laws (The Washington ruling class explicitly excluding themselves from the aforementioned acts. Local leaders mimicking their tyranny. Conformists at any socio-political level are untouchable because they do not dissent, while faithful dissidents to the super-state are spied on, censored, doxed or worse.)

V. Hostilities thus commenced by the British Troops, have been since prosecuted by them without Regard to Faith or Reputation (Total persecution of citizenry, including, but not limited to Christians, celebrities, presidents, musicians, athletes and certain outlier media groups. Child abuse in public and private schools is acceptable now because they need the public funds.)

W. They accordingly delivered up their Arms, but in open Violation of Honour...the Governor ordered the Arms deposited...to be seized by a Body of Soldiers; detained the greatest Part of the Inhabitants in the Town, and compelled the Few who were permitted to retire, to leave their most valuable Effects behind” (The ultimate goal to end the 2nd amendment, priming us for invasion. Incremental destruction of private property and personal defense.)

X. ...for erecting in a neighboring province...a Despotism dangerous to our very existence; and for quartering Soldiers upon the Colonists in Time of profound peace. (The post January 6th military barricade of the US Capital—pure despotism, characteristic of a communist Soviet Union or Nazi Germany. This protest, examined in lieu with the greatest election fraud of modern history, was not just remarkably nonviolent, but miraculously peaceful and constructive.)

Y. We should regard those oppressive measures as freemen ought to do (Citizens of America. Public servants. Private companies. Religious organizations. You should all regard these actions and behaviors as ruthless, despotic, intolerable and oppressive. If such evil was endured and identified before we became a country (1775), then how must we respond today?)

Z. ...sent over fleets and armies to enforce them. The indignation of the Americans was roused, it is true; but it was the indignation of a virtuous, loyal and affectionate people. (Indeed, the January 6th gathering was not marred by lawlessness and death, but proudly marked with indignation. People of all ages and ethnicity, from every walk of life, including the elderly with fanny packs, were portrayed as terrorists and enemies of the state. Arrests followed, as unelected intelligence groups pinpointed and abducted those guilty of the crime of indignation. Many were held without charges.)

American His “TORY”

As you can see, we are not experiencing a hiccup in American life—all twenty six abuses are manifesting openly. The question to ask, is why? How is it possible? In a word, “history”. But we cannot understand our history apart from understanding the “Tory”. *Tories were people unconvinced that Britain was the enemy of America.* They were dead wrong. They were your neighbors. Your pastors. Your clients, friends and family. In the late 18th century, there were many neutrals and fervent supporters of government overreach. But in those days, one could argue that they had a good excuse. The early inhabitants of America did not foresee the independence of the burgeoning republic—Tyranny was normal operating procedure. They never saw the glorious “United States”, and therefore were given a brief pass on their ignorance. Former Tories needed time to comprehend what independence from Britain could look like. Today, we have no excuse—we have two and a half centuries to reflect on. Today, we have the ABC’s.

What is a modern Tory? There are two extremes. One is represented by an ultra-liberal or “woke” elitist, who has no concept of history or common sense. Another can be a social conservative who takes no

action. They support forced vaccines and all the rest, either directly or via inaction. They can read all 26 letters, and not even blink. A Tory supports unconditional civil obedience. A tory never challenges public opinion. [Toryism](#), in context with our American Revolution was the prevailing view, that a global Monarchy is valid—that we should just shut up and put up. In context with today, Toryism is on par with culturalism, which is the idea that culture (*how we currently feel and behave*) should drive public policy. But culturalism is a cancer. Allowing the culture to carry on, is what led to imperial monarchies—it's how slavery got established here, among other evils. Toryism/culturalism is fueled by the weak and cowardly—it relies on individuals refusing to confront their friends and close associates. This spirit saturates teachers' unions, labor unions, the Democratic Party and the Republican Party.

So what are the vaccines for this rapidly spreading spirit? Toryism is always held to account by *objective journalism*—this is why free speech was placed at the very top. It took the printing press, allied with grass roots patriotism to defend against Britain. It took sacrifice to lose clients, or to be estranged to family on the wrong side of history. *America was not improved by the cowardice of the Tory, but built on the principle of the Patriot*. Patriots are willing to confront each other—even their best friends. Patriots are willing to take tough interviews. Patriotism is fueled by courage. Real patriotism ended slavery, segregation, civil rights abuses, and soon enough...*abortion*. We must ensure that this Covid-19 continuation does not culminate into a modern day fatal 19th.

Toryism: False unity. Losing theories that sound good when divorced from history and common sense.

Patriotism: Christian unity. Courage under fire. Outcomes that work for everybody. Sacrifice.

Tories are non-confrontational push overs. They are passive aggressive, fence riders who wait to leverage an outcome. Why though?
